1. Apologies

2. Minutes of the Previous Meeting (13th November 2018)

4. Quarry Developments

R Davenport outlined the current quarry development. R Davenport explained that a mid-summer overburden campaign had just been completed. This lasted 8 weeks. An overview of the remaining phase of working was also provided. Mr. Carter enquired about the dewatering pumps and asked when these are turned off post-extraction, how long would it take for the quarry to flood. M Davies suggested it would be dependent on groundwater rebounded levels and natural rainfall, but indicated it would be potentially 7 years. It was also noted that the 3 other lagoons adjacent to the plant site would still remain operational during the proposed quarry extension.

Water Discharge Monitoring

All weekly results for 2019 so far have been within limits for suspended solids (parts per million). The discharge to Loach Brook is water removed from the quarry to allow dry working. The water discharge is tested weekly.

5. Planning and Estates Matters

5.1 Bent Farm West

L Williams indicated that the planning application had been confirmed valid by Cheshire East Council as of the 22nd May 2019. The planning application is currently out for consultation and the target date for determination is 11th September 2019. L Williams outlined that the material will



be conveyed under the road via a concrete tunnel with a total value of 1.1 million tonnes of reserve. Work would probably commence in 2021 and there will be 8-10 years reserve life. The quarry will be operated from south to north. The site would be restored largely to agricultural land with a waterbody within the south of the site.

Cllr Bailey asked about access and egress to the Holford site. R Davenport showed the plant site development slide and a service vehicle access route would be located adjacent to the bungalow. This will purely be for light service vehicles and mobile plant. Strictly no HGVs.

6. Council Matters:

6.1 Parishes

Smallwood Parish Council – no issues. Brereton Parish Council – no issues.

6.2 Cheshire East Council

Nothing to report, although the Holford application would probably be determined within 2-3 months.

7. Any Other Business

B Jelf asked what was going to happen to the lake after quarry completion. L Williams explained that Sibelco leased the land so this was ultimately for the landowner to decide. He also confirmed that whatever the landowner wanted to do, they would have to seek the necessary authority to do so. L Williams agreed to supply the approved restoration scheme to members of the liaison group.

R Davenport gave an overview of various community events that had taken place. We recently sponsored part of the Astbury May Day where we provided help with labour in the run up to the day and also had a presence on the day with a craft / tree planting stall. Sibelco also provided sand for a sand pit.

Sibelco Bent Farm Quarry has had visits from Sandbach Under 8s Rugby Team and also Sandbach Under 16 Football Team. This is following the sponsorship of the 2019 kit.

Sibelco have provided sand to Congleton Football Club.

M Davies is happy to consider any further local requests.

R Davenport asked whether the council would consider moving the weight limit sign from the Brownlow Crossroad to the A34 to prevent heavy vehicles using Wallhill Lane. The council will take it on board and review.
