

A letter from the Rector, Anne- Marie Naylor

Retaining wall between churchyard and Peel Lane

Behind the scenes at St Mary's Astbury is a continual programme of inspection and preventative maintenance to keep this ancient and important structure in good order.

With increasing traffic along Peel Lane, coupled with heavy rainfall over recent months, we need to do some work to assess the continued stability of the high retaining wall between the churchyard and Peel Lane. Last week, a stone fell out of this unexpectedly, which means that we need to carry out inspections at short notice, and install measuring devices to check whether there is any structural movement.

Until this been carried out, we have been advised that vehicular access to the road alongside the wall needs to be restricted to one lane only through a traffic management system. The initial work will take place over a one-month period, and we will then be in a position to assess what further work (if any) needs to be done.

We are aware that this will inevitably cause some inconvenience to road users in the parish and do apologise for this in advance. We will do our best to minimise this. We will endeavour to keep the Parish Council informed as matters progress.

ASTBURY ROLL OF HONOUR 1914-1918

Frank GOODWIN: William GOODWIN: These two soldiers were brothers. Frank was born on 11th. February 1889 in Eaton, nr. Congleton (where his family were living in 1891) William was born in Alcumlow on 13th. November 1894. Their parents were James and Annie Goodwin (nee Davies.) In 1901 the family are living in Alcumlow, Moreton, where James is an agricultural labourer and Frank and William are scholars at Astbury School.

Ten years later, on the 1911 census, they are residing with their parents at Alcumlow Cottages, Moreton, father James is a farm labourer, **Frank** is 22 and working "on the roads" for Cheshire County Council, **William** meanwhile is living not too far away at Old Moreton Farm (near Little Moreton Hall) working as a carter for James Dale.

I can't find any surviving papers for **Frank's** service, but **William** must have been very keen and signed up at the start of the war on 2/9/1914 at Chester, where he is described as a chemical labourer aged 19 years 10 months, of Alcumlow, near Astbury. It seems that he moved around quite a bit. He started in the South Lancs. Regiment as a private, service number 15239, moving on to the Cheshire Regiment, a private, service number 16078, finally moving to the Royal Engineers as a sapper (construction, maintenance and repairs). Happily, both survived the war and in 1921 they are living back at home at Alcumlow, with their parents. **Frank** is back with CCC as a roadman and **William** is working as an estate worker for Mr. Peel at Great Moreton Hall.

Frank married Annie Daniels at Astbury church in 1927 and they went on to have a daughter Hilda in 1928. William married Florence Carr in a civil ceremony in Congleton in 1924, and they had 4 children. In 1939 Frank, still a roadman for CCC, and family are still living in the parish at 3 Brownlow Council Houses and William and family are residing at the rather vague address of Brownlow Cottages (close to Bank house) he is also now a road man for CCC.

Frank and his wife were buried at Astbury church in 1969 and 1978 respectively. William and Florence were also buried in Astbury in 1970 and 2001 respectively.

Ralph GOODWIN:

Ralph was born in Wall Hill, Astbury in 1892 the son of James and Sarah Ann Goodwin, and christened at Astbury Church on the 10th. July 1892. By 1901 the family are not at home, but are visiting James' brother Ralph at Wall Hill, where James is classed as a miner, hewer and loader underground. Ten years later in the census of 1911 Ralph is working as a waggoner at Somerford Farm, Somerford. Meanwhile, his father, now a widower is still living in the parish on Wall Hill Lane, with one of his daughters.

Unfortunately no military records have so far surfaced and I haven't yet managed to find Ralph on the 1921 census or the 1939 register, so I have no further details at present.
