Planning – big changes ahead...

In November, 7 members of the PC attended a seminar on the proposed changes to the way planning applications are processed. There is a huge backlog of such requests (about 80,000 in fact), and the changes will mean householders may find it easier to substantially extend their homes (the backlog is from domestic applications), while business submissions will become much more complex...good news for some, bad for others. The Parish Council's views will carry more weight, but once again, we need to know your views to take them into consideration.
