

# Updating the Neighbourhood Plan

The Astbury+Moreton Neighbourhood Plan was adopted - 'made' in the jargon - five years ago, and in that time has proved increasingly useful in controlling development in our two parishes. It gives the Parish Council criteria against which planning applications can be judged, and Cheshire East Council frequently cites its policies in their planning decisions. Developers, too, increasingly take its policies into account in their applications. However, since 2017 national planning legislation has evolved, and Cheshire East Council has fleshed out its Local Plan with many more specific policies. We therefore need to review and update our Plan to take these changes into account. It's also a good time to take stock and see whether the Plan still reflects the wishes of our community. The Parish Council has set up a working group, a team of councillors and residents, to carry out this work. We've already started, using the input from the open meeting to draw up a revised vision and aims for the Plan: now we need to test how well it meets our community's ideas. The diagram shows the steps we're taking to produce a revised version of the Plan, and where we're up to.

Once we've reached that stage, there's a formal process we need to follow, involving Cheshire East Council, probably an independent external Examiner and possibly another referendum of our two parishes - more on that later. This is where you come in: enclosed with this Newsletter is a questionnaire to test your views. Please take a few minutes to complete this survey, either the printed version or an online version - full details in the questionnaire. All residents can submit their own views, not just one per household. We will of course share the results with you via our website, https://astbury-parish.org.uk/neighbourhood-plan/.

## Update on the common land at Brownlow Heath

The working party visited the common land on 1/09/22 and were amazed at the extent of the nettles which have virtually taken over, even encroaching on the wood-chipped pathways. Working to reduce these is considered a priority, while avoiding established wildflowers as far as possible. Planting with a mixture of wildflower seeds appropriate for the conditions should then follow this autumn, as well as native daffodil bulbs and English bluebells being scattered around the site. The hedge saplings planted this year down the left hand boundary have taken well, despite the hot weather, and only one new tree seems to have been affected.

These proposals will be considered at the next Parish Council meeting, currently postponed because of the late Queen's mourning period. Please check the website and notice boards for this date.

## Update on the War Memorial

Work continues on research into the men who laid down their lives and who are entitled to be added to our War Memorial. Thirteen men have been approved so far.

### Roll of Honour

John Carter HEASON unfortunately seems not to have any surviving military records. The Heasom/Easom family appear to have lived in the Astbury area for some time. His great grandfather Peter Heasom/Easom was born around 1790 and according to the censuses was born in Astbury. He was buried in Astbury 2/1/1878 aged 89. His grandfather Thomas was born in 1830 in Astbury, marrying Emma Crawford in Astbury 22/8/1858. Daniel, their son (John's father) was born and baptised in Astbury 3/3/1867, marrying Mary E Carter 26/3/1894 again at Astbury. Their son John Carter Heason was baptised 31/5/1896 at Backford near Chester. John is subsequently found on the 1901 census aged 4 living with grandparents Thomas and Emma near to Dubthorne. On the 1911 census he is aged 14 and a farm labourer still living with his widowed grandmother Emma , but now in Astbury Marsh. After the War he shows up in 1922/23 on Electoral Rolls as a gardener near to Bodmin in Cornwall, by 1924 he is in Cold Overton, Leicestershire, in 1925 he married Elsie May Hulme in the Hereford area, and on the outbreak of War in 1939 he is living in Chiqwell, Essex with his wife and is still gardening. He died 15/10/1963 in Leytonstone, Essex.

Edward DODD. Edward was the son of Annie (Hannah) Dodd, of Bank Farm, Dodd's Lane, baptised at Astbury church 11/10/1898. On the 1901 census he is still living at Bank Farm with his mother, a dairy maid, born Bunbury, and grandfather Job a farm bailiff born in Tattenhall. By 1911 Edward is still at Bank Farm, now aged 12 and still at school. His mother is not residing there any more but he still lives with his grandfather, now described as a farmer, widowed aged 69. I can find no trace of any Military records so far, and have been unable to trace him after the war.
